About ADRA

The Adventist Development and Relief Agency (ADRA) is the global humanitarian organisation of the Seventh-day Adventist Church. ADRA exists to serve humanity so that all may live as God intended. Through its international network, ADRA facilitates the delivery of relief and development assistance to individuals in more than 118 countries—regardless of their ethnicity, political affiliation, or religious association.

ADRA's Asia Regional Office is based in Bangkok, Thailand and was established to provide administrative and programmatic support to ADRA offices in Asia. The support includes strategic planning, financial system advice and monitoring, organisational and development, design program development, program evaluation and human resource development.

In Asia ADRA currently operates in seventeen countries. These are: Bangladesh, Cambodia,

China (Hong Kong), India, Indonesia, Japan, Laos, Mongolia, Myanmar, Nepal, Pakistan, Philippines, South Korea, Sri Lanka, Thailand, Timor Leste and Vietnam. ADRA has also previously operated in Malaysia and North Korea.

ADRA's History

Established in 1956 by the Seventh-day Adventist Church, ADRA underwent two name changes before becoming the Adventist Development and Relief Agency (ADRA) in 1984. While our name changed throughout the early years, our core principles remained. In 1958, SAWS reported disaster relief shipments to 22 countries with a total value of \$485,000. Four years later, the number of countries increased to 29, totalling \$2.3 million worth of supplies. By the mid-1970s, we began to broaden our mission from disaster relief to long-term development projects in vulnerable communities. In 1997, ADRA was granted General Consultative Status by the United Nations, the highest status given to nongovernmental organisations. This allowed us the opportunity to participate in the international community on a broader scale.

Today, ADRA is a leading humanitarian agency operating in more than 118 countries with a dedicated team of over 6,000 staff and volunteers. While our offices are often miles and oceans apart, we work together as a unified whole, bringing positive transformation to a world in need. In 2016, 15.7 million lives were impacted by the compassion and generosity of ADRA supporters and partners all around the world.

ADRA's Approach

ADRA works with people in poverty and distress to create just and positive change through empowering partnerships and responsible action. At the core of our mission is the deep conviction that through empowering partnerships, we are able to create positive changes and meet the challenges and opportunities posed by the Sustainable Development Goals. We pursue strong, equitable relationships with community-based and grassroots organisations to ensure that our work directly impacts those who need it most. We also rely on the invaluable partnerships with governmental and nongovernmental partners—on all levels—to foster lasting change in the countries we work.

For decades, ADRA has maintained a strong partnership with agencies of the United Nations. By supporting UN initiatives and implementing programs on the ground, ADRA and the UN work jointly to meet the needs of the world's poorest. Through our membership in the United Nations Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC), we participate in discussions on innovative thinking and sustainable development. Throughout the years, ADRA has forged partnerships with the WFP, UNHCR, WHO, UNICEF, and other UN Agencies. Together we reached an estimated 14 million people around the world in 2019 alone.

ADRA's Accountability

At ADRA, we are committed to implementing a high standard of transparency and financial accountability in business practices, as well as in the design of our programs. Through a licensing and accreditation mechanism ADRA offices around the world are held to a common set of standards that align with the Core Humanitarian Standards and the Global Standard for CSO Accountability. The ADRA International annual and financial reports are available and provide an overview of the global impact of our worldwide network.
